FUMA Endowed Scholarships for General Cadet Use

<u>Ralph C. Alexander, Jr. Scholarship</u>—Created in honor of Mr. Alexander, class of 1939, who stoically served as a US Air Corp pilot during World War II, this scholarship is awarded to young men with a demonstrated financial need who are enrolled or enrolling in the 12th grade.

<u>Robert B. Barnes III Family Scholarship</u>—Created by the Barnes family to provide tuition assistance to qualified cadets with demonstrated financial need as a desire to complete their high school education at FUMA.

<u>Lin Bates Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mrs. Nancy Bates and named in memory of her husband, class of 1948, this scholarship supports an outstanding returning cadet.

<u>Guy E. Beatty Scholarship</u>—Founded by one of FUMA's strongest and most generous supporters, this scholarship provides funds for young men with a demonstrated financial need.

<u>Bishop Trust Scholarship</u>—Established by the estate of Inez Duff Bishop, this scholarship is awarded to outstanding young men with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Joel T. Broyhill Scholarship</u>—Established to honor Mr. Broyhill, class of 1939, who served 11 terms in the US Congress, this scholarship supports young men needing financial assistance to attend FUMA.

<u>Charles (Randy) Bruce Scholarship</u>—Established by Mr. Bruce, class of 1969, this scholarship supports young men with a demonstrated financial need and a desire to attend FUMA.

<u>Camp Scholarship</u>—Established by John Camp to provide scholarship support to upper school students. <u>General & Mrs. John Chain Scholarship</u>—Established through the planned gift of GEN Chain to support young men with demonstrated financial need who wish to enroll at FUMA.

<u>Paul Frederick Cobb Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mr. and Mrs. Bobby Cobb, class of 1971, and named in honor of his brother, a member of the class of 1962 who was killed in action during the Vietnam War, this scholarship is awarded to a young man who demonstrates leadership and integrity.

<u>Frank A. Crockett Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mr. David Crockett, class of 1949, to honor his father's service to FUMA.

<u>George & Leeda Currin Scholarship</u>—Established by Mr. and Mrs. Currin, class of 1954, this scholarship supports young men with a demonstrated financial need who wish to attend FUMA.

<u>Andrew R. Dodge Meritorious Award in History</u>—Established by Mr. Dodge, class of 1965, this scholarship is awarded to the winner of a research paper competition concerning either a

transformational event occurring in US history during the period of the late 18th century through the 20th century or the US Constitution.

<u>Dwyer Family Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mr. and Mrs. Paul Dwyer, class of 1976, this scholarship helps a young man who will benefit from attending FUMA and exhibits character and academic excellence.

<u>Justin Stuart Edell Scholarship</u>—This scholarship, founded by Dr. and Mrs. Dean Edell to honor their son, a member of the class of 2009, provides a merit-based scholarship to a cadet who has attended since his sophomore year and has achieved the highest grade in mathematics.

<u>Scott A. Feathers Scholarship</u>—Founded in the memory of Scott Feathers, class of 1981, and awarded to a rising 9th grade day student.

John L. "Buck" Fraley Scholarship—For academically qualified students who have a desire to attend FUMA and who demonstrate a financial need.

<u>Greenbrier Scholarship</u>—This scholarship was formed by the Greenbrier Military School Alumni Association to ensure that Greenbrier's spirit lived on after their school closed and is presented to an outstanding returning cadet, with preference going to a native of West Virginia.

<u>Travis Hall Scholarship</u>—Established by Mr. Wes Hall, class of 1957, to honor the memory of his son Travis, class of 1984, this scholarship is awarded to a young man with demonstrated financial need who desires to attend FUMA.

<u>Michael Scott Hamby Scholarship</u>—Founded by the parents of Mr. Hamby, class of 1999, and given to the cadet who has exhibited the greatest improvement in attitude and/or self-esteem since arriving at FUMA.

<u>Jack Haring Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mrs. Jinny Haring in memory of her husband, a member of the class of 1952.

<u>Fred Hoffman Scholarship</u>—Awarded to the Quartermaster Assistant each year, this scholarship is named in memory of longtime FUMA Quartermaster Fred Hoffman.

<u>Samuel W. Holdcroft Trust Scholarship</u>—established in 1995 this fund provides scholarship support to young men with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Hunter Trust Scholarship</u>—Provides scholarship support to young men with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Lt. General John E. Jackson, Jr. Leadership Scholarship</u>—Founded in honor of Lt. Gen. Jackson and his wife Barbara by Mr. and Dr. Callaway, this scholarship is given to a young man who demonstrates extraordinary leadership qualities and character.

<u>Lt. General John & Barbara Jackson Scholarship</u>—Founded in honor of Lt. Gen. and Mrs. Jackson, this scholarship is awarded to outstanding young men with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Alfred H. Koeller Jr. Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mr. Kenneth B. Koeller, class of 1951, to honor his brother's memory and provide young men who demonstrate a strong desire to attend FUMA with scholarships.

<u>Greg LaCour Scholarship</u>—Established by Mrs. Denise LaCour in memory of her husband, this scholarship is awarded to a deserving Upper School cadet who exhibits the highest standards and demonstrates the greatest promise as a future leader of the Corps of Cadets.

<u>Gus Lacy Alumni Scholarship</u>—Created in honor of Gus Lacy for his service to the Academy's Development Department, this scholarship is awarded each year by the Alumni Board to a rising junior. <u>Mr. Edsel "Jack" Lester Scholarship</u>—Funded in honor of Mr. Lester, class of 1951, for cadets with a financial need.

<u>Mrs. Shirley Wright Lester Scholarship</u>—Funded in honor of Mrs. Lester to provide scholarships to young men who demonstrate need and display academic excellence.

<u>T. Fields Montgomery Scholarship</u>—Donated by Mr. and Mrs. George Turner, class of 1955, in honor of Mrs. Turner's father who was a dedicated supporter of education. This scholarship provides support for a cadet to attend through his senior year.

<u>Major Craig Moon Endowed Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mrs. Marion Moon in honor of Major Moon, class of 1976, this scholarship is awarded to cadets who show integrity, character, leadership, and humility. <u>Herbert C. Mosley Scholarship</u>—Named in honor of long-time Trustee Herbert C. Mosley, this scholarship supports academically qualified young men who are returning to FUMA.

<u>Edward A. Payne Scholarship</u>—Named in honor of a former math teacher at FUMA, this scholarship is awarded to a cadet who shows integrity, character, leadership, humility, and patriotism.

<u>COL R. L. Pulliam & Mrs. Patsy Pulliam Scholarship</u>—Founded by alumni and friends to honor COL and Mrs. Pulliam's dedication to FUMA, this scholarship is awarded to a young man who demonstrates friendliness, thoughtfulness, high moral values, and good sportsmanship.

<u>Giles B. Raisner Jr. Memorial Scholarship</u>—This scholarship, named in memory of Mr. Raisner, class of 1944, is awarded to a young man who demonstrates scholastic achievement and integrity.

<u>Raper Family Scholarship</u>—established by the estate of Robert Raper, class of 1949, this scholarship is awarded to an outstanding young man with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Mrs. Bette H. Reiser Scholarship</u>—Founded by Mr. Walter H. "Bill" Reiser, class of 1952, this scholarship was established to celebrate the life of his beloved wife and is awarded to young men with a demonstrated financial need who embody FUMA's core values.

<u>Jon Richardson, Jr. Access Scholarship</u>—Founded by the estate of Mr. Richardson, class of 1978, and supported by his wife and father, this scholarship provides support to young men with a demonstrated financial need who wish to attend FUMA.

<u>William F. Rowe III Scholarship</u>—Established to honor the memory of Mr. Rowe, class of 1942, this scholarship is awarded to a rising senior with demonstrated financial need who adheres to and embodies the FUMA principles and motto of Body, Mind, Spirit, with preference given to a young man from the Fredericksburg, VA area.

<u>Bernard E. Siddons Endowed Scholarship</u>—Established by Mr. Siddons, class of 1953, and awarded to a cadet who exemplifies leadership, integrity, and a positive attitude and has a demonstrated financial need.

<u>CSM Glenn Sidwell Leadership Scholarship</u>—Established by former cadet Peter Congdon and his father John Congdon, Jr. to honor the service of CSM Sidwell to generations of young men and awarded to selected returning cadets with demonstrated financial need and leadership ability.

<u>Mary Margaret Smith and Maude Lester Smith Scholarship</u>—Established by Dr. James H, Smith, class of 1953, in memory of his wife and mother, this scholarship provides support to young men with a demonstrated financial need who wish to attend FUMA.

<u>Jamal Thomas Scholarship</u>—This scholarship was founded by Justice Clarence Thomas in honor of his son, a member of the class of 1992, and is awarded to a cadet with a demonstrated financial need. <u>Whitman B. Wiatt Scholarship</u>—Founded by Susan and John Wiatt in memory of Whitman Wiatt, class of 2000, and awarded to a cadet who demonstrates integrity, character, leadership, and kindness. <u>David M. Word Scholarship</u>—Established in memory of David Word, class of 1982, by his mother Mrs. Frances Word, this scholarship is used for outstanding young men with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Class of 1943 Scholarship</u>—Created by the class alumni to provide scholarship support for an outstanding cadet with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Class of 1952 Scholarship</u>—Founded by the estate of a class member, this scholarship supports young men with demonstrated financial need.

<u>Class of 1954 Scholarship</u>—Established in honor of their 50th reunion to help young men who demonstrate leadership at FUMA.

<u>Class of 1955 Scholarship</u>—This class scholarship honors the legacy of the class of 1955 as alumni while helping a new generation of young men attend FUMA.

<u>Class of 1966 Scholarship (66 for '66)</u>—Established in honor of their 50th reunion to help young men with a demonstrated financial need attend FUMA.

<u>Fletcher Arritt Scholarship</u>—This scholarship was founded by friends of Coach Arritt, class of 1960 to honor his retirement, and supports postgraduate basketball players attending FUMA.

<u>Coach Bill Blair Postgraduate Scholarship</u>—This scholarship is named in honor of Coach Bill Blair, class of 1949, to support Postgraduate football players seeking to attend FUMA.

<u>Gus Lacy Track Scholarship</u>—Named in honor of FUMA's longtime track coach Gus Lacy to support scholarships for track athletes each year.
